The farm's mission is to promote the connections between healthy farms and clean ager by employing ecologically appropriate farming practices, educating young and beginning farmers, and partnering with the community to support a strong local food system. The farm is managed by Cascade Pacific Resource Conservation & Development, a regional nonprofit organization that helps solve community problems by bringing partners together to accomplish conservation and community development projects.

Winner of the 2015 Sargent Shriver Award Has a Connection to WCPCA

My friend, Ralph Bolton, is the winner of the 2015 Sargent Shriver Award and will receive the award at the NPCA annual conference being held next week in Berkeley. Ralph was among the first Peace Corps volunteers in Peru in 1962 and served in the Altiplano of southern Peru for three years where he worked with Quechua speaking communities. After a devastating flood in 1963 on Lake Titicaca, where Ralph was working, families lost their homes, land and animals. With the help of the Peruvian government, Ralph assisted many families in relocating and creating a new community, named Chijnaya, on higher land. Today, Chijnaya is recognized as one of the most progressive indigenous communities in the Peruvian Altiplano.

I started working with Ralph in 2006 a year after he started the Chijnaya Foundation which currently partners with

15 Altiplano communities who work together to improve education, agriculture, health and artistry. My work with Ralph has been in four alpaca herding communities in improving the genetic stock, wool quality, herding practices and marketing of alpaca fleece.

Ralph, who recently retired after a 40-year teaching career as a professor at Pomona College, worked many years as an anthropologist focusing on Andean cultures. His research took him back to Peru often and ultimately inspired him to form the Chijnaya Foundation. Ten years ago Ralph recruited RPCV's to help with his projects, several of us volunteered. Last year, the Amigos de Bolivia y Peru nominated Ralph for the Shriver Award which he will receive on June 6. His compassion, understanding and accomplishments to some of the poorest communities in Peru are deserving of the Sargent Shriver Award.

Good for you, Ralph Bolton.

Funded Project: Maternity Ward in Zambia

WCPCA has decided to help fund a Peace Corps project in Zambia. Katie Van Marter Sanders is proposing the building of a maternity ward to allow women to have a safer delivery with a skilled nurse. Zambia has one of the highest rates of maternal death in the world with 591 women of 100,000 live births ending in death due to complications. The neonatal death rate is 34 per 1000 births. These figures are some of the highest in the region. Only 47% of women have a skilled nurse during childbirth.

This Oregon volunteer is hoping to have an impact on these statistics. She has already raised nearly \$1500 and the community has contributes \$11,864. The goal is \$19,018. WCPCA will contribute \$400.

WCPCA will be contacting the Volunteer to request updates of her project to share with members.
