- *Help greeting/registration (15-30 minutes)








WCPCA Project Funding Update

WCPCA decided to support a Peace Corps Library Project in Madagascar with a \$500 contribution. Sam Hollerup is a graduate of the University of Oregon and in currently serving in Madagascar. Sam along with 18 other volunteers, are planning on bringing 22,000 books to 17 Malagasy communities. "Each of the communities to receive books has expressed a need for English books and has enthusiastically demonstrated commitment to the project through collaboration on the project design and contributions.

Communities have provided spaces for the books, shelving and tables for their storage and use, and librarians for their maintenance. They have also made repairs, attended trainings, and developed plans constituting how the books will be managed in anticipation of their arrival." Peace Corps Announces Major Changes to Application Process (July 2014) (article suggested by Dorothy Soper)

"Our former process was long and bureaucratic and cumbersome," Hessler-Radelet said. "We feel that today's applicants have career goals and have professional goals and they have strong opinions about where they want to serve. . . . We want to honor that as best we can."

The Peace Corps will hope to avoid leaving potential volunteers in limbo, part of a package of changes that officials think will make the organization more appealing to the nation's under-30 crowd.
