Each month features a colorful photo, taken by a PC volunteer, in a country of service. The 2017 calendars feature Peru, Figi, Argentina, Uganda, The Gambia, Togo, Micronesia, Morocco, Ghana, Mongolia, Armenia and Indonesia.



Curry for a Cause Benefit

Last year's event netted close to \$2,000 and enabled us to make significant donations to projects of Oregon volunteers — including a project of First Lady Michelle Obama's Let Girls Learn initiative — through the Peace Corps Partnership Program (PCPP). Peace Corps has partnered with the Let Girls Learn program to start and carry out projects to help educate some of the 62 million girls — in developing countries worldwide — who would benefit.


This year's event, scheduled for October 15th, 5:30

Peace Corps Budget and WCPCA Advocacy

In response to a request from the National Peace Corps Association, the West Cascade Peace Corps Association sent the following letter to Senator Merkely to encourage his leadership in supporting a budget of \$450 million budget for FY2017. The current budget is \$415 million, so this additional funding would, among other things, help increase the number of Peace Corps volunteers. We also invited him to speak at our fundraising dinner on October 15, 2016.

Dear Senator Merkley:

On behalf of the West Cascade Peace Corps Association (WCPCA), we are writing to thank you for your support of the Peace Corps, and ask for your leadership in working with your colleagues on the State, Foreign Operations Appropriations Subcommittee to support a budget of \$450 million for FY 2017.

WCPCA represents about 130 Returned Peace Corps Volunteers (RPCVs) living in the Southern Williamette Valley, especially around the Eugene-Springfield area. Our members represent all decades

of Peace Corps service - from the early 1960s to the 2010s. We understand that in FY15, more than 5,000 qualified applicants were turned away due to lack of funding. We are proud of our service and eager that more are Americans get the opportunity to serve. An increase in funding would allow the Peace Corps to increase the number of Volunteers serving in more communities around the world.

Our Association is also active in contributing funds to Peace Corps projects organized by current Oregon Peace Corps volunteers serving around the world. Funds come from, among other sources, our annual fundraising dinner, which will be held on October 15, 2016. If your calendar allows, we would be honored to have you speak at this important event. Last year more than 170 people participated and we are hoping for an even larger turnout this year!

Finally, the University of Oregon in Eugene is one of the leading institutions in recruiting Peace Corps volunteers. WCPCA works closely with the campus Peace Corps recruiter to maintain this admirable record.

Thank you again for your leadership in working with your colleagues on the Subcommittee to provide the Peace Corps with the resources it needs to continue making an impact. A bigger, better Peace Corps is what America and the world need today!

THERE IS STILL TIME ... to sign up for the WCPCA Campout August 12-14, 2016

RESERVATIONS: The first ten reservations received will secure a campsite; any reservation requests, after the first ten, will be on a wait list. Please make checks to WCPCA for the amount of \$30, mail to Patricia Mac Afee, PO Box 5022, Eugene 97405. Also include your phone number, email address, and number of people in your group.

Lost Prairie Group Campground is located 37 miles east of Sweet Home on Highway 20. It has ten sites, two sites can accommodate RVs 24 feet or less. Additional motor homes may use the paved parking lot. This campground was converted from individual sites to a group campground, so the tent sites have ample space. WCPCA has the entire campground reserved for August 12-14 (arriving August 12, leaving August 14 – two nights camping). There are vault toilets and no electricity.

Things to do: the campground is located near scenic hiking trails: Santiam Wagon Road, Cone Peak, Iron Mountain, Hackman old growth trail, and several others. Clear Lake is a twenty minute drive if people prefer boating.

Meals: Campers will be responsible for their own meals, except for a Saturday evening group meal. WCPCA will provide the fixings for the main dish.
